>> We are taking steps to stage the best Congress to date

in terms of content, advertising, presentations, attendance of managers, media impact.etc.Wewanttoensurethatitgoes beyond its trade fair borders and permeates the entire city, so we have created a programme of activities before and during the congress that will provide spacesto entrepreneurs, large corporations and citizens both at the fair and throughout the city. One example is the new edition of Mobile Week, with activities on scientific dissemination. debates on innovation and digital culture, transgressivetechnoartproposals and a comprehensiveprogrammeto helpyoung people understand the digital world better.

What has MWC contributed to the city?

The Congress and capital of mobile technology have helped us to develop allthe necessary ingredients to convert Barcelona into a true international innovation hub, where major impact projects are born, talent is attracted and opportunities are generated to test and develop disruptive technologies.

And what do you think its contribution will be in the future?

In the short and medium term, we will see how the Congress and capital leave alegacyat both a local and national level. Barcelona is already digital and aspires tobean international 5G laboratory, presenting to us the creation of companies and projects resulting from this ecosystem. Barcelona Smart City

AS HOST CITY OF **MOBILE WORLD CONGRESS**, BARCELONA HAS BECOME A SMART CITY. LET US TELL YOU **HOW TECHNOLOGY CAN HELP YOU IN YOUR VISIT**

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Barcelona today is the mobile world capital, the first Smart City in Spain and the fourth in Europe, as it continues to strive daily to be a smarter city. It also appears in the world ranking of cities with the highest degree of technological development. This data was published in 2017 by the specialist website Business Insider, which listeditas the onlySpanish city. The assessment highlighted its network of pollution and noise measuring systems, fleet of bicycles, interconnectivity in public transport, access to free Wi-Fi, USB ports and mobile charging points... And also its growing number of technology compa-

nies and audiovisual, programming and design services, especially since the developmentoftechnological districts such as **22@**, where more than **1,500** companies related to media and information technology are concentrated. This knowledge cluster district helps to position Barcelona only behind London, Berlin, Paris and Amsterdam in terms of sector preferences.

In addition to this position is the fact that Barcelona has hosted the Mobile World Congress since 2006. The 2018 edition is to be held from February 26 to March 1 and includes the Mobile Week Barcelona (Feb. 17-24) initiative, a weeklongactivityopentocitizensandvisitors that looks at how digital changes have been integrated into our lives through art, science and technology. The main theme of this year's edition revolves around one idea: the future of today. and the event brings together artists, scientists, philosophers, engineers and industry professionals, with discussions that are open to the general public on the new experiences that digital transformation are providing us. It also features exhibitions and activities, many of which take place at the Mobile World Centre, the exhibition space of the MWC Foundation in Placa Catalunya.

If you visit the Catalan capital you will notice its outstanding degree of connectivity, because it is a leader in technological transformations linked to the guality of life and safety. It therefore has an advanced infrastructure network that includes Wi-Fion public thorough fares, with more than 800 free connection points, a fibre-optic network, 4G technology, close to 40 mobile applications offering useful information to its inhabitants and visitors and even a smart street, Avd. Josep Tarradellas, with sensors that adjust lighting depending on the presence of pedestrians. In addition, Barcelona is one of the world venues of the Fab Labs network (fabla-

bbcn.org), a set of 100 digital manufacturing centres in more than 30 countries.

Getting around easily

The city's **public transport** network deserves special mention, with its own applications providing information about waiting times, USB ports, the possibility of charging your phone in transport vehicles and **free Wi-Fi** connection on the city's buses. The network ofmunicipal car parks also offers applications that enable you to find a parking space. **ApparkB** (areaverda.cat) is an app that helps you to pay for parking easily. It will save you time and money and you can forget about having to go to the parking metre and paying formore time on your parking slip.

Another tool to help you get around the city is the app by **TMB**, the company



responsible for the metropolitan transport system (available in Spanish and English at www.tmb.cat/en/barcelona/applications-downloads). It contains all the information you need and a system to calculate the fastest, easiest routes. You will also benefit from applications like **Taxi Ecològic** (taxiecologic.com) or **GoCar**, a fleet of small three-wheeled convertibles offering a guided GPS tour that will tell you about points of interest and many anecdotes (available attickets.barcelonaturisme. com). **MyTaxi** (mytaxi.com) is another useful app for you.

Andgrab a **Wifivox** device, yourpersonal Wi-Fi point, to connect your computer, tablet or mobile to the Internet at any time. It is a small pocket modem that you can hire through tickets.visitbarcelona.com and it provides you with unlimited Internet access. Wifivox offers you a 3G mobile connection and you can create a wireless network to cover up to ten devices within a radius of 15 metres.

Getting to know Barcelona

All you need is your smartphone to carrythe city in your pocket. You can download the Official Barcelona Guide app (apps.barcelonaturisme.com) and all that it has to offer in the most comfortable, interactive and fastest manner possible: more than 1.500 references and 350 photos. The app has it all: museums, hotels and restaurants, shops, parks and gardens, theatres, music, sport, festivals... It includes navigation lists by areas of interest and categories, as well as routes, map visualisation with geolocation, etc. and is available in Spanish, English, French, Italian and German.

Barcelona Metro Walks (apps.barcelonaturisme.com) is another interactive guide with seven itineraries through Barcelona's neighbourhoods using the city's metro network. Each itinerary has a map, diagram and explanation of the places to visit and photograph. And for the many people who love jogging, **360 Running Barcelona** (360 runningbarcelona.com) is a priva-

BY BIKE

If you want to move around Barcelona in a fast, sustainable way, the best way to do so is by bicycle. **eBike City Tour** suggest you discover the city on a comfortable electric bike alongside a professional guide who will show you why this is one of the most valued European capitals because of its life quality. You have three routes to choose from: **Barcelona Highlights**, a panoramic tour visiting the city's most em-

If you want to gain a greater insight into one or more of Barcelona's ten districts, go to the official City Council website, where you will find useful information to discover these 10 Barcelonas (meet.barcelona.cat/en/discover-barcelona/districts). BCN Paisatge (paisatge.bcn.cat/en/) is another municipal initiative, an online visual guide on the most original things to discover about the city's urban landscape. And there is also BCN Visual (ajuntament. barcelona.cat/apps/en/bcn-visual), available in Catalan, Spanish and English, to help you discover what Barcelona was like before using old photos of buildings and streets. Also available in the same three languages is **Nearby** (ajuntament.barcelona.cat/apps/en/ nearby-prop-daqui), a quick and easy wayto search for services and points of interest.

And don't forget **Barcelona Mapp** (smartechgroup.es/barcelona-mapp), an augmented reality map of the city that can be downloaded for free on your smartphone or tablet. It enables you to visualise points of interest (buildings and monuments) with 3D models on its map and simultaneous audio guides in several languages. But Barcelona does not end at its city limits, so the **Barcelona Is Much More** app (barcelonaesmoltmes.cat/en/web/planifica/ app) will provide you with all the tourist information you need to choose from a

Anotherway to get the most out of online information is to rent a tourist iPad: Barcelona iPad Tour, a tablet equipped with the best applications for travellers, such as 3D maps of Barcelona, online routes, openinghours of museums and monuments or translators, among other features. You will be connected at any time and in any point of the city and you will have at your disposal the agendas of leisure, culture, sport and family activities. as well as a whole lot more. You can reserve your iPad through tickets. barcelonaturisme.com and receive it wherever you indicate. Another way to discover the city in an interactive manneristhrough the treasure hunt offered by UnPuzzle Barcelona (tickets.barcelonaturisme.com), an adventure that

promises two or three hours of fun by following the clues you will get when answering the questions and solving the riddles you will receive on your mobile. An original and very entertaining way to stroll through the streets while discovering many curious things, learning about history and legends and taking photos of anything that catches your eye. You can enjoy **five different routes**: Born in El Born, Gothic Labyrinth, Modernista Barcelona, Romantic Barcelona and Lost in Time.

Culture in one click

As expected, technology has also joined



forces with art and culture to help disseminate these better and further. Many applications offer routes, detailed information, visits to museums and exhibitions, literary tours, etc., so let us recommend a few of them to you.

Medieval Barcelona (apps.barcelonaturisme.com) is useful for history lovers, consisting of the perfect audio guide to discover medieval. Romanesque and Gothic architecture in the city, available in Catalan, Spanish, English and French. Gaudi's Barcelona (apps.barcelonaturisme.com) follows the same structure, also in an audio-guide format with more than one hour of information to discover the work of this Modernista architect through eleven unique buildings. available in Catalan, Spanish, English and French. The third is **22**@Barcelona (apps. barcelonaturisme.com), another audio guidewith more than an hour of information about the city's last major urban project: the transformation of the industrial district of Poblenou into a sustainable space that has become a hub of activity linked to technological innovation. Heritage and urban, technological and business innovation with 150 images, practi-

caldata and geolocation that you can use bothonline and offline. **Barcelona Art Públic** is a perfect way to discover art in the city. It consists of a catalogue of sculpturesand other artistic pieces in public spaces, with information on their location, artist, year of construction and expert commentary, available in Catalan, Spanish and English.

If you love museums and heritage, download **Visitmuseum** (visitmuseum. gencat.cat/en), available in Spanish, Catalan,EnglishandFrench.Itcontainsallthe informationaboutmuseumsinCatalonia: their features, tours of their main rooms and a detailed view of their most outstanding objects. And don't forget the app by the **Union of Catalan Art Galleries (GGAC)** (galeriescatalunya.com/landing/), an indispensable tool to discover first-hand about exhibitions, artists, related events, art agenda, location of each gallery, etc.

Discover the hidden stories of Barcelona's streets through **Literapolis**-



bcn (aiuntament.barcelona.cat/ciutatdelaliteratura/en/literapolis-bcn-literarygymkhana), an interactive literary treasure hunt in which you can choose one of the three itineraries for each novel in various city neighbourhoods (Sarrià, Born, Eixample and Sant Antoni), listen to guotes from the books and solve riddles. It is a family activity aimed at voungpeoplebetween14and18inwhich players must locate various real geographical points in the city where the action of a book takes place. Once each place has been geolocated, and after solving a testorariddle, you are rewarded with new information and can continue playing.At the end of each it in erary you receive a prize. The app is available in Spanish and Catalan.

Casa Batlló is also strongly committed to new technologies and you can now also learn about it from a new perspective, with a more pronounced technological, interactive and sensory vision of the building and Gaudí. The newly restored space is part of a 2,000-m2 guided tour that will surely captivate visitors. Museums also offer interesting virtual experien-

ces. Headto the Gaudí Experience to gain agreaterinsightintothefigureofthisgreat Modernista architect and his work It offers a spectacular way of learning more about Gaudí through virtual 4D screenings. And don't forget the Gaudí Exhibition Centre, the first Gaudí museum to host the exhibition Walking with Gaudí, an essential stop where you will understand more about the work of this architect in an entertaining manner, discovering original pieces such as unique models and digital creations and a series of devicesthatwilloffervouaninnovativevirtual reality experience using augmented reality and interactive content.

You can also physically orvirtually visit the **Museu de les Cultures del Món** through a comprehensive app that offers



you a visit based on four itineraries: 90 min., 45 min., for people with visual difficulties or for those with hearing difficulties. The museum houses pieces from various cultures in Africa, Asia, America and Oceania and is located in Carrer Montcada, directly opposite Museu Picasso and housed in the former Nadal and Marqués de Llió palaces.

The Bom Centre of Culture and Memory also has its own application, Barcelona 1700 (elbomculturaimemoria.barcelona.cat/elbom3d), with key information to understand the site in relation to the space it is housed in today.

Anotherleading museum in the city is **MACBA**, Museu d'Art Contemporani de Barcelona, offering free Wi-Fi connection throughout the centre and an augmented reality application that provides you with a different visit. Download it on your mobile, look for the icons in the shape of an eye and scan them. Wherever it may seem to you that there is nothing, a world to be explored may indeed open up there.

Shopping and technology

Inaddition to culture and restaurants (see Food and Drink, page 20), Barcelona's shops offer virtual experiences and use technology to improve their services and your shopping experience. You will find free Wi-Fi at Desigual, as well as service devices in its changing rooms and interactive screens in its sales area. At Sephora (Pelai, 13) you can try makeup, eye shadoworlipstickon their interactive screens and based on a collection of 110 skin tones you will find out which colour suits you most, or you can personalise your own perfume in its Drops Fragrance Experience area. If you go to Etnia Barcelona (Espaseria, 1), you only have to try on one pair of glasses to see all the available

Dancewillfeatureverystronglythismonth. From February 8 to 25, **Mercat de les Flors** is staging a unique event, the **Sâlmon Festival**, the place to be for contemporary dance. A must for lovers of the most risky and innovative shows in the performing arts, it will be held in various venues throughout the city: Antic Teatre, CaixaForum, Espai Fabra i Coats, Fundació Miró, Graner, Sala Hiroshima and MAC-BA, as well as Mercat de les Flors. Among its most outstanding shows are performances by Ana Borralho and Joao Galante (Feb. 8 and 9) and Amalia Fernández.

Traditions and technology

Barcelona hosts its traditional winter festival, the Festes de Santa Eulàlia. from February 9 to 11. It is celebrated in honour of Barcelona's second patron saint (known as Laia). February 12, and focuses on two main areas. On the one hand, popular culture plays a major role. You will be able to see the most typical traditional activities, such as 'castell' (human tower) displays, which will open the season; 'correfocs', featuring fire runs and devils: giants and big heads wanderingthrough the streets and squares; striking folk dances dating back to medieval times... Many museums and institutions will also be opening their doors for free during the festival, such as the Town Hall, Museu Nacionald'Art de Catalunva. Museu Picasso, Mies van der Rohe Pavilion, Fundació Miró and Palau Güell. among others.

And don't miss out on the **Llum BCN Festival**, held during the evenings of February 16, 17 and 18, when light and technologywillcombine to illuminate special buildings and spaces in the **Poblenou** neighbourhood, home to the **22@** district, as well as also highlighting the beauty and uniqueness of Barcelona's architecture. A unique opportunity to view the city's emblematic spaces and corners through light and colour.



BARCELONA LIGHTS UP

On February 16, 17 and 18, the weekend after the Santa Eulàlia celebrations, light will transform various places in the city as part of Llum BCN, a festival of light that celebrates its seventh edition this year. This year it has moved to a new location: the **Poblenou** neighbourhood, home to the innovative **22@** district. More than a dozen renowned national and international artists will present their new ideas for transforming the city's spaces through light.

Students from 14 schools of architecture, art and design have prepared special displays focusing on creative lighting to showcase the city's emerging talent.

Art and exhibitions

The **Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya**, housed in the Palau Nacional de Montjuïc, is a must-see sight and even more so after the last remodelling process of a part of its permanent heritage collection. Since late January, its Renaissance and Baroque collections are now pre-

sented in a new manner to cover more than 300 years of art history featuring a host of great painters (Velázquez, Zurbarán, Titian, Tintoretto, El Greco, Cranach, Canaletto, Goya...).

On February 22, the museum is also premiering a fascinating temporary exhibition entitled *William Morris and the Arts & Crafts in Great Britain*, which will run until May 20.

You can still visit the exhibition *Fernando Vijande. Portrait: 1971-1987* until April 7 at **Fundació Suñol**, in the Eixample district (Passeig de Gràcia, 98), focusing on the figure ofthis major gallery owner, who helped to consolidate many artists and was committed to avant-garde movements. **Fundació Mapfre** (Diputació, 250) is located in the same area, housed in the unique Casa Garriga Nogués. Here, from February 19, you can visit a comprehensive retrospective on **Brassaï**, a key 20th-century figure whohelped to redefine and enrich European and American photography.

New BCN Modernisme Pass

And make sure you also get to discover the best of Catalan Modernisme, its places and secrets, with the new **Barcelona Modernisme Pass** smart card from Turisme de Barcelona, available attickets.visitbarcelona.com and all tourist information offices. It provides you with free entrance to various Modernista spaces both in Barcelona and nearby towns, as well as a complete guide containing detailed information on these spaces, maps and additional Modernista activities.



With the BCN Modernisme Pass you can visit, for example, **Casa Amatller** (Passeig de Gràcia, 41), by Josep Puig i Cadafalch, which used to be the home of the industrialist Antoni Amatller; **Casa de les Punxes** (Diagonal, 420), by the same architect, a medieval-style Modernista mansion with a rooftop terrace that offers strikingviews of the city; **Palau de la Música Catalana** (Palau de la Música, 4-6), a world famous concert hall by Domènech i Montaner, located in the central neighbourhood

The Pass also includes the Sant Pau Modernista Site (Sant Antoni M. Claret, 167), a series of pavilions designed by Domènech i Montaner that used to house one of the oldest hospitals in Europe; Casa Vicens (Carolines, 20), Gaudí's first major project in Barcelona and recently opened to the public, in the Gràcia neighbourhood. and Palauet Casades (Mallorca, 283), a classic, eclectic and unique mansion constructed at the end of the 19th century and today housing the headquarters of the BarAssociation of Barcelona. You will also be able to visit Biblioteca Arús (Passeig de Sant Joan, 26), a hundred-year-old library space with a documentation collection specialised in socialmovements, as well as Palau Baró de Ouadras (Diagonal, 373), a beautiful Modernista mansion designed by Puig i Cadafalch and today the headquarters of the Institut Ramon Llull, or Casa Rocamora (Ballester, 12), another mansion, but this time Elizabethan in style and located in the neighbourhood of El Putxet, housing the art collection of the Rocamora family and including works by the painter and poster artist Ramon Casas. Casa Felip (Ausiàs March, 20) caps off the Barce-



lona tour offered by the Pass, a building that displays the exceptional use ofvarious diverse materials, one of the great hallmarks of Modernisme.

The Modernisme Pass also includes places near Barcelona, such as the coastal town of Canet in the Maresme region, just 55 minutes by train on the Cercanías line, where you can visit the Casa Museu de Domènech i Montaner, the former summer residence of this architect now dedicated entirely to his figure and work. Mataró is also in the Maresme and is worth visiting for Casa Coll i Regàs, a building remodelled by Puig i Cadafalch and influenced by Modernisme and neo-medievalism. In the beautiful town of Sitges, on the Garraf coast, also easily accessible by train, you can visit Museu del Cau Ferrat, the former house and studio of Santiago Rusiñol. Finally, awaiting you in Terrassa are the Museu de la Ciència i la Tècnica and another Modernista icon. Casa Alegre de Sagrera, a museum space in a remodelled country house.
