THE FOUNTAINHEAD

Director: Ivo van Hove. Dramaturgy: Peter van Kraaj. Teatre Lliure - Montjuïc. 2-4 Jul.

8.30pm. €32.

What should an artist do-remain faithful to his or her ideals, or betray them in order to ensure success? Should artists sacrifice themselves to their own principles, or should they choose to survive by adapting to the needs of the community? The author Avn Rand answered these questions in her 1943 best-selling novel that focuses on the struggle between individualism and collectivism, not only in the political arena but also. and above all, in the human soul, Ivo van Hove, director of Roman Tragedies, one of the biggest hits of the Grec Festival in 2013, brings Rand's text to the stage. (In Dutch, with surtitles in Catalan.)

WONDERLAND


Gallim Dance Company. Original idea, direction and choreography: Andrea Miller.

Teatre Grec. 1 & 2 Jul. 10pm. €16-€30.

Choreographer Andrea Miller, named a Guggenheim Fellow by the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, makes her debut in Barcelona with an artistic investigation of pack mentality, inspired by an installation by Cai Guo Qiang, one of the best-known Chinese contemporary artists working today. *Wonderland* is set in a universe that recalls the United States' atomic age.

UBU ROI

By Alfred Jarry. Direction and dramaturgy: Declan Donnellan. Teatre Lliure - Montjuïc. 17-20 Jul. 8.30pm. €30.



In 1896, Alfred Jarry caused a riot with his savage portrait of a cruel, cowardly tyrant whose ambition knew no bounds. Declan Donellan, the renowned director of Cheek by Jowl, reinterprets a classic with a production of *Ubu Roi* in which chaos, ambition and cruelty are set in the context of an elegant dinner, in a bourgeois French household. (In French, with surtitles in Catalan.)

TAUBERBACH

Original idea and direction: Alain Platel. Dramaturgy: Koen Tachelet and Hildegard De Vuyst. Teatre Lliure - Montjuïc. 11-13 Jul. 8.30pm, €26.

Since 2006 Alain Platel has been investigating what he calls 'bastard dance', which, according to him, is what happens when dancers explore areas of the mind unaffected by civilisation. For this show he takes two sources of inspiration: the Tauber Bach project by Polishartist Artur Zmijewski, who asked a group of deaf people to sing Bach as they perceived it, and Marcos Prado's documentary *Estamira*, which focuses on a schizophrenic woman who ekes out an existence in a landfill in Rio de Janeiro. (In English.)

LES CRIADES (THE MAIDS) By Jean Genet. Director: Do Wan Im. Dramaturgy: Ky Choi. Mercat de les Flors. 4-6 Jul. 9.30pm, €28.

In 1998, on his return from studying in France with Jacques LeCoq, director Do Wan Im founded the Sadari Movement Laboratory, a company committed to exploring new theatrical languages. In the hands of the Sadari Movement Laboratory, Genet's play *The Maids* becomes a powerful piece of physical theatre, with a key role played by an item of furniture. It's a large wooden wardrobe, which, in this interplay of dualities – the self vs. others, reality vs. fiction – becomes a psychological space inhabited by both maids and mistress. (In Korean, with surtitles in Catalan.)

BEYOND Mercat de les Flors. 23-26 Jul. 9.30pm. €24.

Beyond invites you to explore limits: the line that separates human and animal, madness and sanity, logic and dreams. With warmth, feeling and the occasional dose of surrealism, the members of Circa not only demonstrate their impressive skills – as they did in Grec



2013-but also reveal the shadows that exist in human nature and, most important of all, a universe of emotions and tenderness.

LA PARTIDA (DEALER'S CHOICE) Author: Patrick Marber. Director: Julio Manrique

Teatre Romea. 2-31 Jul. Mon-Fri 8.30pm; Sat 6 & 9pm; Sun 6pm. €17-€27.

Julio Manrique once again immerses himself in the theatrical world of playwright Patrick Marber, as he did in *Senyoreta Júlia* (After Miss Julie), Marber's version of Strindberg's classic play. This time, Manrique directs a play the British author wrote as an unknown, which, with an all-male cast, uses a poker game to meditate on themes that go far beyond cards. As one of the characters says, 'You must play the man, not the cards.' (In Catalan.)

LE CAPITAL (EL CAPITAL) Staging: Sylvain Creuzevault Teatre Lliure - Montjuïc. 24-26 Jul. 8.30pm. €30.

With productions such as *Le Père Tralalère* and *Notre Terreur*, French company D'ores et déjà and young director Sylvain Creuzevault have captured the attention of the French theatre scene. These collective works are the result of enthusiastic experimentation by the company's artists, thought-provoking improvisations directed by Creuzevault with a rare theatrical wisdom. He now brings his skills to bear on an even more difficult challenge: to stage the secret structures of the capitalist world around which our lives are organised, as revealed in *Capital*, Karl Marx's difficult, unfinished work. (In French, with surtitles in Catalan.)

VICTÒRIA D'ENRIC V Author: William Shakespeare. Version and direction: Pau Carrió. La Kompanyia.

Teatre Lliure - Gràcia. 9-11 Jul. 9pm. €24.

Director, dramaturge and musician Pau Carrió has recruited La Kompanyia Lliure to perform this Catalan-language version of Henry V, following the character from his first appearance in Henry IV. They tell the story of Henry, a young prince of whose future kingship no one expects much. After his coronation, he decides to wage a war against France, which, contrary to expectations, he wins. But what does he gain from this victory?

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SUN

Choreography and music: Hofesh Shechter

Teatre Grec. 9-10 Jul. 10pm. €16-€30.

The world is a wonderful place... but it can also be dangerous, warns the creator of choreographies that range from *Uprising* to his latest hit, *Political Mother. Sun*, produced with support from the Mercat de les Flors, is the most recent show from Israeli-born Schechter, who danced with Bathseva Dance Company and has gone on to become a leading name in contemporary dance in Europe.

VADER (FATHER) Peeping Tom Company. Dir: Franck Chartier

Mercat de les Flors. 16-18 Jul. 10pm. €26.

Vader takes place in the visitors' lounge of a nursing home, whose high walls suggest that the action is set in the underworld. In the darkness sits the figure of the father, who seems to be gradually distancing himself from the human community. Peeping Tom, the company that won over Gree audiences in 2012 with the widely-praised 32 Rue Vandenbranden, brings the first part of a trilogy of dance and drama about fathers, mothers and children to Barcelona for this year's festival. (In English.)

NERIUM PARK Author and director: Josep Maria Miró

Mercat de les Flors. 17-20 Jul. 8pm. €20.


In 2012 he was one the Grec Festival's big revelations, as writer and director of *Elprincipi d'Arquimedes*. This year Josep Maria Miró returns with a work that was shown at the most recent Temporada Alta Festival in Girona, as the winner of the Quim Masó Prize. Gerard and Marta, two thirtysomethings with brilliant futures ahead of them, move into the house they have bought in a new estate in the suburbs, but the estate begins to fall apart as fast as the two characters' hopes for the future. (In Catalan.)

EELS

Eels, the band fronted by Mark Oliver Everett (aka E), are back in Barcelona

Radical theatre company La Fura del Baus celebrates its 35th anniversary with a revolutionary new show, *M.U.R.S.* – the first-ever smartshow, a collective challenge that will transport you to a future world in which the ideals that should govern cities are exploited down to the ultimate consequences. To what extent will we be free and able to understand our own lives?

MATA'M

Author and director: Manel Dueso La Villarroel. 4 Jul - 3 Aug. Tue-Sat 8.30pm; Sun 6.30pm. €22-€26.

Mata'm (Kill Me') begins with a gunshot, a scream and a murder that looks a lot like suicide. With moments of humour laced with Green Chartreuse, this play captivates from the start, inviting you to reflect on your hopes and expectations. (In Catalan.)

Farrés Brothers & Company Teatre Lliure. 7-8 Jul. 7.30pm. €12.

6 years and over. In Catalan. In this show the Farrés Brothers & Company play the brothers Fabrice and Philippe Montgolfier, direct descendants of the inventors of the original 'aerostatic' hot air balloon. The show takes place inside one of these balloons, which the brothers have converted into a very special craft: the ecstatic hot air balloon.

THE SHADOW OF PINOCCHIO Néstor Navarro

Director: Carolina Llacher La Puntual. 2-13 Jul. Wed-Sat 7pm; Sun 8pm. €9. 3 years and over. In Catalan.

Who could have guessed? The

boy who was once a puppet has grown up and is now a man. And when it was time to choose a profession, he followed in the footsteps of his father, Geppetto, and became a puppeteer. Archive-tecture

Following the recommendations of the Architectural Archives of Catalonia, **Eugènia Sendra** discovers a route that sticks close to the sea.

The Architectural Archives of Catalonia came into being in 2008. born out of the curiosity of four students, who started an inventory of buildings and examples of urban design that were not part of the official curriculum. The driving forces behind this Quixotic task were Manuel Iulià. Aureli Mora, Omar Ornaque and Lucas Sentís, now fully-gualified architects, who continue to add to an archive that includes 2.000 entries on buildings, public works, landscaping, and interior and industrial design projects all over Catalonia. Based on their exhaustive catalogue, they created a walking route for us.

IN SIGHT OF THE SEA

The start line is the Moll de la Fusta, the city docks refurbished by Manuel Solà Morales in 1987. 'This was the classic example of how to open the city up to the sea, integrating infrastructure and services,' recall my guides, Manuel, Aureli and Omar. The pergolas, Roy Lichtenstein's *Head* and the Columbus monument are the visual references of a seaside promenade that has been overshadowed by the Maremagnum complex, and with the city's ring road roaring beneath it.

The second stop is a public space designed by two architects, Olga Tarrasó and Jordi Heinrich, who,



among others, gave shape to Barceloneta's Passeig Marítim after 1995. Their objective was to preserve the views of the streets, looking out towards the sea, through the trees and the Kanya lampposts the architects designed for the project.

We jump to the mid-20th century Barceloneta to discover the work of Josep Maria Coderch: as well as the Casa de la Marina, there are the blocks of workers' housing on the Plaça del Llagut. They're simple but worth a closer look. 'There are architects who are inherently interesting, and even the less brilliant parts of their work should be preserved, to understand it as a whole, 'says Aureli. All three draw attention to the biomedical research park, with its stepped profile, central courtyard and wood-covered exterior.

We walk on to the Olympic village. The land-use plan, begun in the '80s by MBM studio, created superblocks, mixing different kinds of dwellings with unique buildings, such as Bach i Mora's Central de Telefònica, or Álvaro Siza's squat circular meteorological centre. Enric Miralles, working with Carme Pinós, also left his mark on Av. d'Icária. 'It contrasts with the Fòrum area, where there are buildings by figures like Nouvel, Herzog & de Meuron i Perrault, but no underlying vision of city planning.' Heading to the Fòrum's esplanade, the route ends where Cerdà's Av. Diagonal meets the sea, as he intended. Here we find the Illa de la Llum by Clotet i Paricio, an original way of building intermediate spaces, with galleries and sliding shutters.

'Architecture is a culture that's difficult to pervert, it's there to serve people's needs,' says Manuel. If it's well-made and comfortable, like a pair of trousers, you don't even look at it.' The architectural archives invite us all to take a look at our own trousers, to discover architects and read the history of the city.

The Immaterial Legacy

The MACBA brings together a selection of art from the late 1970s to the early 1990s. By **Ricard Mas**

The MACBA are now showing the first of a trilogy that takes a look at the works from the museum's collection from the 1980s, and as I walk among the halls, my inner curator is screaming out, like one of those friends we all have who think they can coach their favourite football team better than the actual coach.

Ah, the'80s, the age of disenchantment. After Kennedv and Pope John XXII, it was Reagan, John Paul II and the punks. And after the death of the bogevman, the dictator Francisco Franco, Spain witnessed the birth of modern artistic and cultural institutions Artists who had once criticised the system would no longer lift a finger without some kind of subsidy. But the MACBA sees it differently. The collection is the home country, in disposable form, showing a provocative revision of history. It's a history with a revolutionary backdrop, in which the working classes armed themselves with dance music, Basque rock, fanzines and appropriationism.

Organised around familiar themes like 'the sacred and the profane' and 'the body and its inverse', the works form the basis of lengthy essays. You can read them or not. And this changes the effect. Carlos Pazos's installation could be a jumble of references, or a secret semiotic drama, and Humberto Rivas's photographs of the drag artist Violeta la Burra, a violation of the social norms of the body.

My internal curator prefers to let his imagination run riot, and not read the labels – the critic however, does – and wander through the *INTERFACEs* (1977) of Richard Hamilton and Dieter Roth, remembering what great artists they were, these two adoptive residents of Cadaqués, or to discover how Antonio Beneyto – who you might bump into on C/Ferran with a book under his arm – portrayed punk goddess Nina Hagen (1982). How times change! –*Ricard Mas*

Music Great Cruïlla!



The Cruïlla Festival marks the beginning of summer, as far as the city's music festivals are concerned. We've survived Primavera Sound and Sònar, and made it to July wanting more. A festival that started out as a modest initiative has grown year after year to become an important date in the musical agenda. This year it is extended to three days, and the line-up features international luminaries of the stature of Damon Albarn, (Blur, Gorillaz), who will be presenting his first solo work, *Everyday Robots*.

But the best and most original aspect of Cruïlla is the huge variety of genres and artists that it squeezes onto the same programme. This year's headliners include Jack Johnson, Band of Horses, Calle 13, Zaz, Emir Kusturica & The Non Smoking Orchestra, and Macklemore & Ryan Lewis, making their only appearance in Spain this year as part of the festival. Friday and Saturday around 20 artists play each night. Sunday, this year's bonus night, features only two: French singer Zaz and Catalan group Blaumunt.

The law of the street

Fred Guzzo opens a venue of his own: a restaurant club, with live soul and R&B and museum-standard urban art. By **Ricard Martín**

Since the sad demise of the Bel-Luna Jazz Club, Barcelona has lacked a venue that successfully combined a restaurant with music of black origin. Now veteran promoter and DJ Fred Guzzo has taken a step in the right direction with his brand new project, Guzzo. I wasn't sure about naming it after myself. I was thinking of calling it Congo Square,' he says. But he decided against it: appropriating the name of jazz's ground zero, the square where slaves in New Orleans came together to play music, seemed excessive.

It stands just in front of the Born

market: as if in a symbolic act of revenge, Guzzo has set up his nightclub/ art gallery/restaurant where there once stood a particularly ugly branch of Barclay's bank. 'We evicted a bank to make room for nightlife, music and culture,' he says, delighted. One of the city's best DJs specialising in jazz, funk and music with African rhythmic roots in general, Guzzo can be proud of his homonymous club: it's a marvel of interior design, between the industrial aesthetic and the home-made spirit – fantastic. He wanted music, art and communication, and he didn't settle for



half measures. Works by international names in urban art decorate the place, and there's a wall where clients can add their own. They stamp and send the postbox. They open at midday for lunch, offering an unpretentious, homey menu, with Asian and French touches, filets alongside nem.

As for the music, 'We have sound insulation up to 85 decibels, so we can do what we like,' says Guzzo. Their intention is to revive the spirit of the original Café Royale, 'where people didn't come just because this person was DJing or this person was performing but because there was always something going on.' Theirs is not a conventional programme but they prefer to announce surprises with minimum notice (a last-minute concert featuring Raynald Colom and the Re-Fugees and Sarah Pi with a string quartet!), and big-name visual artists can drop by at any time to

create new works. Best of all there's beer for €2, G&Ts for €6, cocktails for €7, a decent meal, €15. Guzzo, the Born needs you.

DIY Web

Guzzo has the only dead letter box in Barcelona: a hard drive with a USB outlet installed on a wall, where you can up-and download files without the oversight of the Internet. Messages can also be left with pencil and paper.

Vinyl afternoons

The club will be programming DJs from 6pm-they plan to have a club atmosphere by 7pm - and Fred Guzzo will be in charge of the late-night sessions. They open Wed-Sun noon-3am, Tue 5pm-3am, and close Mondays.

Creative cuisine

D.O. Vins i platillos

One of the first bars in Barcelona to offer a wine list and raise their tapas and tasting dishes to delicatessen level. It's next to the Verdi cinema, so you'll need a miracle to find a spot just before or after a film. They serve wines by the glass and elaborate tapas, such as their courgette flower tempura with cheese, or cod loins with tomato confit. It might not be the cheapest eatery in Barcelona, but the delicacies on offer will take your mind off your wallet. Verdi, 36. 93 218 96 73. Fontana (L3). Mid-range.

Dos Palillos

Albert Raurich, formerly of El Bullí, proves that Asian and Spanish tapas have a lot of common ground. His creativity and the quality of his output have won him his first Michelin star. Dos Palillos is the perfect fusion between a Spanish tapas bar and a Tokyo sushi house. *Elisabets, 9. 93 304 05 13. Catalunya (L1, L3). Expensive.*

Enoteca

Chef Paco Pérez, from the seaside town of Llançà, won his first Michelin star in Barcelona, but he did it by staying true to his roots, the traditions of the fishing villages of Cap de Creus, where cooks pride themselves on getting the very best from the finest seafood. His sea cucumbers with wild mushrooms are unmissable. *Marina*, 19-21 (Hotel Arts). 93 483 81 08. Ciutadella/Vila Olímpica (L4). Deluxe.

Local lenses

Fran Tevo, the founder of Wilde, both shop and brand, with Cao Azuaje and TeppeiKikugawa, hands me a hefty volume entitled A Graphic History of Optics, by J.M. Borja Devesa, to prove that in the world of glasses, there's nothing new under the sun. We were talking about the trend for wooden frames, and Fran informed me that Inuit people have worn wooden snow goggles for generations. Be that as it may, this is about Barcelona, and Wilde doesn't make wooden frames. So let's forget the Inuit for now. It's six years since the team at Wilde (Joaquin Costa, 2) opened their vintage evewear store, and three since they began designing their own. They draw inspiration from the classics, and make them using acetates that pass through 15 machines.

But if it's wood you crave, all roads lead to Palens (www.palens.com). Oscar Palencia, 28, began making glasses in 2012 after a trip to India, and inspired by plastic frames designed to look like wood. Why not make them from the real thing? Today the Palens brand is a byword for hand-crafted frames, made from the finest materials, and a commitment to innovation.

Other designers opting for wood are the brothers Vuerich (www.vuerichb.cc): Baptiste, an industrial designer, and Gianni, a joiner. In 2010 they started recycling skateboards into extra-strong frames, using the core of the original boards. Meanwhile, Unigbrow has just opened a store in the Barri Gòtic (Amargós, 1). Owners Cristina Brossa and Andrew Swiler combine high design and practicality in frames made from a lightweight and resilient plastic used for medical equipment. And the Carl Zeiss lenses are interchangeable. With one set of lenses you can swap frames as easily as changing your shirt.




